## Switzerland: Europe's answer to New England leaf peeping

*Switzerland, August 2019:* New England may be famous for the brilliance of its fall foliage, but Switzerland's autumn colour is equally impressive, especially in the eastern canton of Graubünden where the Swiss National Park, part of the worldwide UNESCO Biosphere Reserve, is located.

Eighty kilometres of footpaths and nature trails criss-cross the 170 magnificent square kilometres of National Park wilderness, offering visitors of all ages and abilities the chance to witness nature at its glorious best. Not just the stunning autumn foliage, but also the wild animals: look for the ibex with their sweeping horns, cute-looking chamois, playful marmots, majestic red deer and maybe a golden eagle (six pairs are resident in the park).

Grand Hotel Kronenhof ([www.kronenhof.com](http://www.kronenhof.com)) in Pontresina has created a “Golden Autumn Days” package to make the most of this very special time of year and it includes, among other things, unlimited use of all the mountain railways in the Engadin/St Moritz area, so that guests can jump on and let the train take the strain, while enjoying glorious views en route.

Other excursions on this rail network lead to Chur, the capital of the canton with its car-free old town that is well worth exploring, and south over spectacular mountain passes and along scenic valley routes, with piercing blue Engadin skies overhead, to Valposchiavo, in the Italian-speaking part of the country.

Of course, there is plenty to do and see even closer to the hotel. Visits to the Engadin at this time of year are particularly popular among keen walkers and artists. Hikers might feel the need to pull on their boots and trek up mountains, but they can also kick off their shoes and sample the benefits of barefoot walking trails in Celerina, a village close to Pontresina, before treating their feet to a little bit of pampering in the warmth of the Kronenhof Spa water-jet pool. Meanwhile keen artists will want to capture the light in the valley, which is so magical it led the 19th century German philosopher Friedrich Nietzsche to believe that he had found “the cradle of all silver tones”.

**Grand Hotel Kronenhof** ([www.kronenhof.com](http://www.kronenhof.com)), located in Pontresina, six miles from St. Moritz, offers the best

of both worlds: the chance to enjoy the glitz of St. Moritz, while staying in a peaceful mountain village.

Grand Hotel Kronenhof has a rich and interesting history, having first opened its doors in the first half of the 19th century as a guesthouse. However, the main part of the current building, which is a registered historical landmark, was built at the very end of the 19th century in Neo-Baroque style. The latest addition, completed in November 2007 and costing CHF 35 million (approximately £24 million), consists of 28 new guest rooms and a stunning spa complex covering more than 2000 square metres.

The spa is certainly one of the hotel's highlights and has been named "the best Alpine spa" (according to Tyler Brule writing in the FT, November 2009). Facilities include a 20m indoor infinity pool with counter-current system, a flotation pool with underwater music, a wide range of saunas and steam rooms, a luxurious private suite for couples to enjoy wraps and massages together, and – for the perfect final touch – a crackling log fire in the relaxation room.

Gourmet cuisine is also a specialty at the Grand Hotel Kronenhof. Awarded the title of GaultMillau Hotel of the Year in 2009, it has three restaurants (the formal Grand Restaurant in an elegant Neo-Baroque vaulted room, Gourmet Restaurant Kronenstübli serving Italian-Mediterranean cuisine with 16 GaultMillau points and the informal Le Pavillon for light lunches). In addition, the hotel features a 19<sup>th</sup>-century original bowling alley where Swiss raclette is served.

Finally, Grand Hotel Kronenhof is renowned for its extensive children's activities and facilities (a kids' playroom and Rondelle, a restaurant just for younger members of the family).
